



## Differences in Peer-Relationship among Adolescents across Socio- Economic Variables

**Abstract:** The present study was undertaken on 460 adolescents of 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> standard i.e., 112 studying in university and 348 studying in government school. Results highlighted that adolescents studying in school had good peer-relationship as compared to adolescents studying in university environment and significant differences were observed in peer-relationship across educational institute. Bullying level was also significantly different across caste and annual income.
